Mechanical Right

Within the music industry, a compulsory mechanical license gives the holder permission to create copies of a recorded song. The rights to produce songs in records are known as mechanical rights.

Disruptive Technology

What is disruptive technology?

A disruptive innovation is an innovation that helps create a new market and value network, and eventually goes on to disrupt an existing market and value network (over a few years or decades), displacing an earlier technology. The term is used in business and technology literature to describe innovations that improve a product or service in ways that the market does not expect, typically first by designing for a different set of consumers in a new market and later by lowering prices in the existing market.

The term "disruptive technology" has been widely used as a synonym of "disruptive innovation"





Industry Impact

- Ability to listen and transmit music in mp3 format creates paradigm shift in industry
- Approximate 350,000 annual mechanical license volume to support LPs, cassettes and CDs increases to 10-20 million license requests per streaming service
- New ability (and requirement) to track every time a song is played and on what service
- Business and technology capabilities must change from single point of sale to tracking millions of 'plays' worldwide
- > From Tower Records, Sam Goody and local retailer to in your car, on your phone and anywhere in the world




